If elected, Donck and Earley will serve three-year terms beginning January 1, 2022.

Donck is vice president, relationship management at Voya Financial, where she provides account management for large 401(k) plan sponsors, with additional roles in the health and wealth arena, including financial wellness. She has extensive human resources and outsourcing benefits administration experience, including defined benefit, defined contribution, and health and welfare. Donck earned the CEBS® designation in 1996, is CEBS Compliant and a Fellow of ISCEBS. She is a past president of the New York Metro chapter, and her ongoing leadership includes currently serving as the education chair. Donck has also served on the Society's Membership and Chapter Development Committee and the Professional Development Committee and has presented at the Symposium. She holds a B.A. degree from the University of Pennsylvania and an M.S. degree from Clark University.

Earley is an account executive at IMA of Colorado, working with public sector clients. Her previous positions include managing benefit plans for CH2M, Sports Authority, Graebel and KinderCare Learning Centers. She has an extensive background with health and welfare plans, wellness and retirement plan administration. Earley earned the CEBS designation in 1999, is CEBS Compliant and a Fellow of ISCEBS. She has served on the Society's Membership and Chapter Development Committee and the Professional Development Committee, is a past president and current board member of the Colorado chapter and has presented at the Symposium. In addition, she has served as a member of the International Foundation's CEBS Committee and is an instructor in the Certificate Series curriculum. Earley holds a B.S. degree in human resource management from Regis University.

Ballots containing the names of these two candidates, as well as any other nominees received through the petition process, will be mailed to Society members in late October. The completed ballots must be postmarked no later than November 15 and returned to Society headquarters for tabulation.

If no nominations are received via the petition process, the mail balloting process will be waived, and the candidates chosen by the Nominating Committee will be declared elected.
