Pension Reform: Have You Saved Your Million Yet?

Pension plans are facing real challenges. On the evening news, front and centre in the daily newspapers, or in conversation with family, friends or colleagues, the topic of pensions and pension regulation is on the mind of many Canadians; it is no longer limited to the board room. At this session we'll take a look at the inequities between private and public sector pension coverage, and what can be done to close the gap. We'll look at the reasons why Canadian pension regulation makes it difficult for many to save for their postemployment years, and whether there is a need for new pension models.

During the last portion of the session, the speaker (recently a panelist on TV Ontario's flagship current affairs program *The Agenda with Steve Paikin*) will highlight key points from his November 2008 C.D. Howe Institute report "A Pension in Every Pot: Better Pensions for More Canadians" that address the disconnect between public and private sector pension coverage. The speaker will then open the floor to your questions and comments.

Mr. Pierlot is an executive member of the Pension and Benefits Section of the Ontario Bar Association. He publishes regularly and has authored a number of submissions to governments on matters related to tax and pension policy. Mr. Pierlot is frequently quoted in the press on pension issues.
